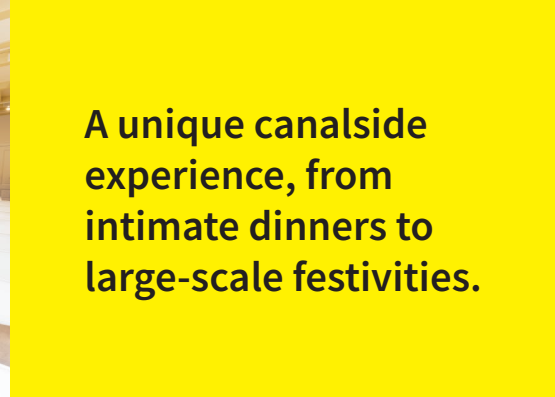

Welcome to the Vrije Academie, a beautiful event venue in the heart of Amsterdam. This listed canal house has a rich history and authentic appearance. The property was thoroughly renovated and renamed Huis Vasari in 2021. With four lecture rooms, a studio, exhibition space, (museum) shop and café, it is now home to the Vrije Academie; the largest arts and cultural education organisation for adults in the Netherlands.

The venue plays host to our own programme, but that's not the only trick up this beautiful building's sleeve. All rooms are for rent, allowing everyone to discover this gem on the Herengracht for themselves! How about a meeting in the authentic 17th-century kitchen or a celebratory dinner under Jacob de Wit's original ceiling paintings? We have the perfect space for every party, for every need and for every wish.

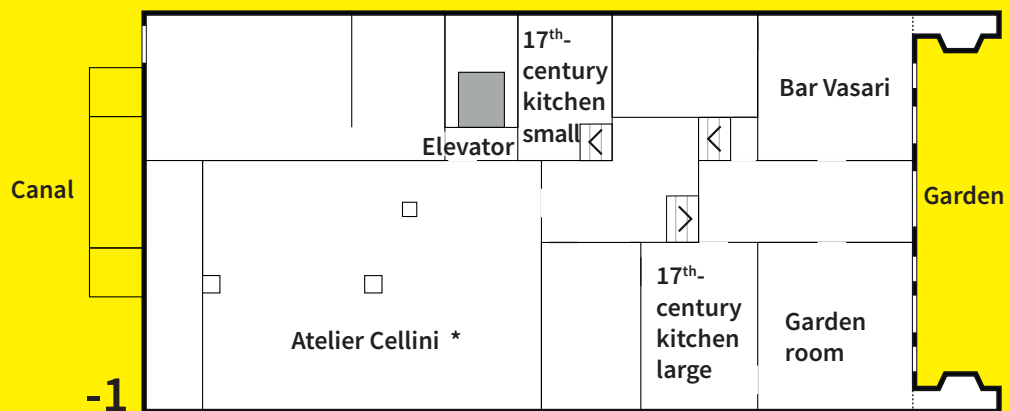
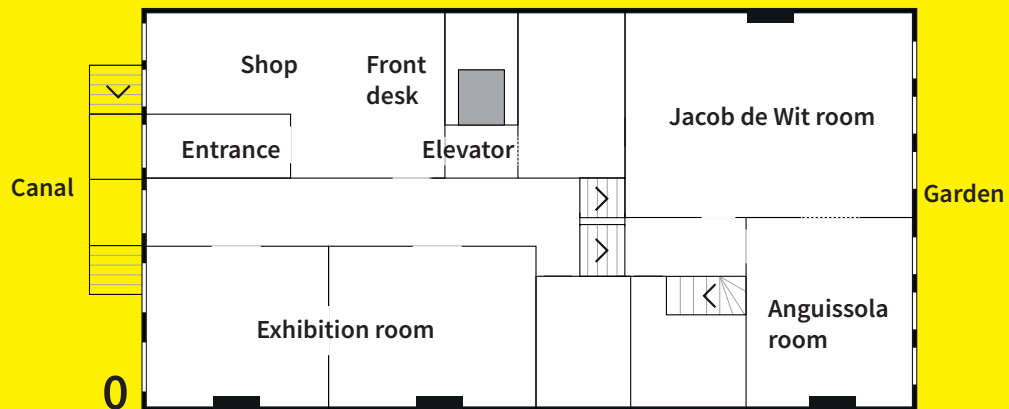
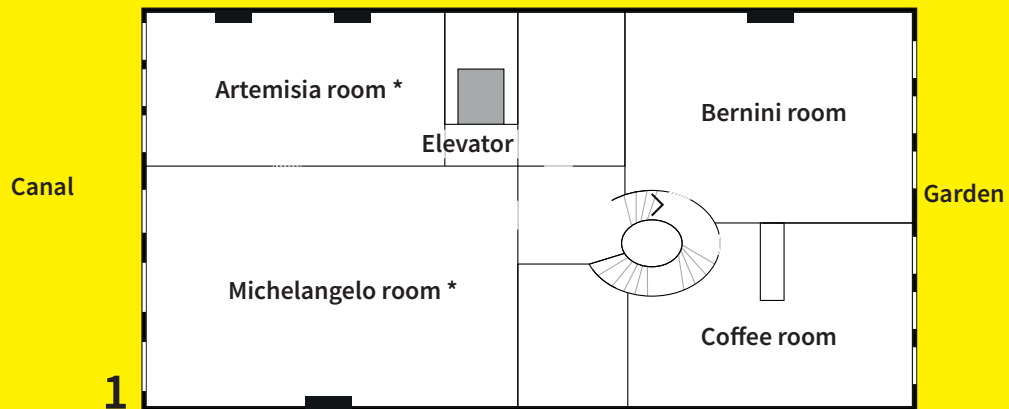

Special history

Huis Vasari is a listed building with a rich history. It was originally built in the 17th century to the design of Amsterdam architect Philips Vingboons, commissioned by Jacob Cromhout. The two joined properties were therefore known as the Cromhouthuizen. Jacob's grandson commissioned then unknown painter Jacob de Wit (1695-1754) to decorate the residence. His ceiling paintings can still be seen in their original state in the historic Jacob de Wit room. Of all the ceiling paintings made by Jacob de Wit, these are the earliest.

Until 2019, the double canal house was home to the Biblical Museum, before Stadsherstel, Amsterdam's body for Urban Regeneration, took possession of the property. A thorough renovation followed, in which original features such as the staircase - perhaps the finest staircase in Amsterdam - the two 17th-century kitchens and Jacob de Wit's ceilings were preserved. Now, as the home of the Vrije Academie, this multipurpose canal house hosts a dynamic programme consisting of lectures, workshops, courses and off-sites.

Plan

The Vrije Academie is home to several meeting rooms, a workshop studio and multiple small break-out rooms, suitable for groups of 4 to 120 people. The property also features its own café: Bar Vasari. The large rooms all feature a theatre layout as standard and are furnished with audiovisual equipment. All rooms can be converted to suit your needs. An unguarded cloakroom is also available.

The building, with a maximum capacity of 500 people, can also be rented in its entirety.

The property is not fully wheelchair accessible.

Jacob de Wit room

Historic room with impressive ceiling paintings by Jacob de Wit, with ten canvases with mythological scenes adorning the ceiling. This is the perfect venue for any big celebration, exuding the style and elegance of a classic ballroom.

The room has an intimate feel, but can seat up to 60 people for a celebratory dinner. For a lecture or presentation, 60 people can be comfortably seated in a theatre layout. The room is equipped with two large television screens, which can be used for presentations. All equipment is connected to the speakers.

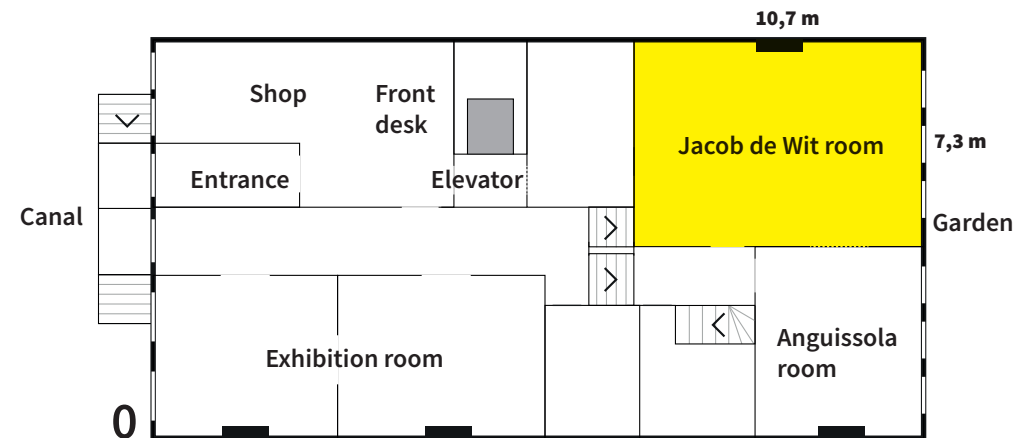

Anguissola room

A stylish meeting room right next to the Jacob de Wit room. As a result, these two adjacent halls can easily be used together. The Anguissola room is set up in a meeting layout as standard, with a generous table that seats 14. It is the ideal setting for interactive meeting or brainstorming sessions.

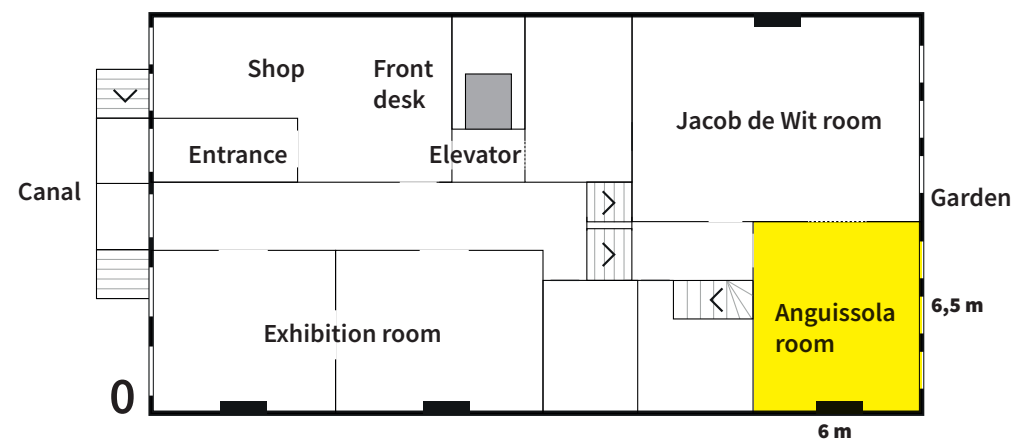
This room does not feature audiovisual equipment as standard.

Michelangelo room

The largest room in the building, blessed with ample natural light and a liberal feel. This versatile room can be used for countless different purposes; a business reception, conference, lecture, presentation or even a walking dinner.

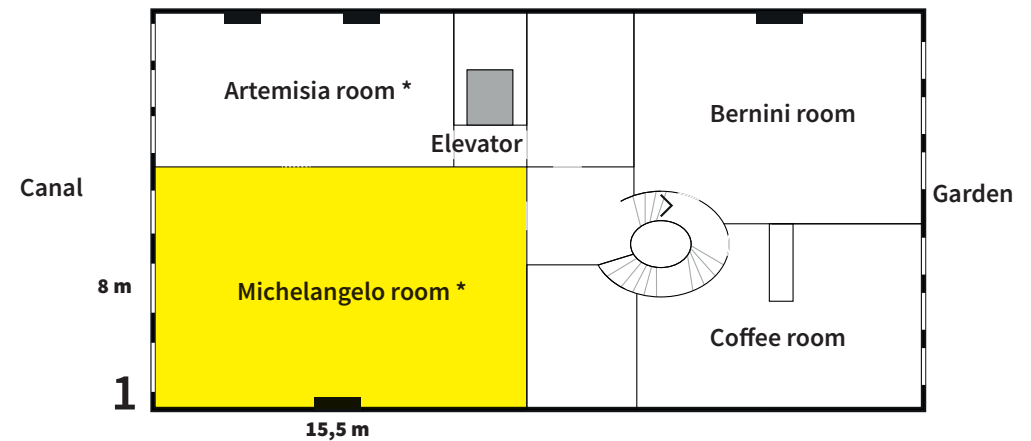

Artemisia room

The room can easily be combined with the adjacent Michelangelo room thanks to the connecting door. There is a coffee room on the same floor, which can be used as an ideal base for a break, small-scale drinks reception or a buffet. The room is equipped with a projector and a screen.

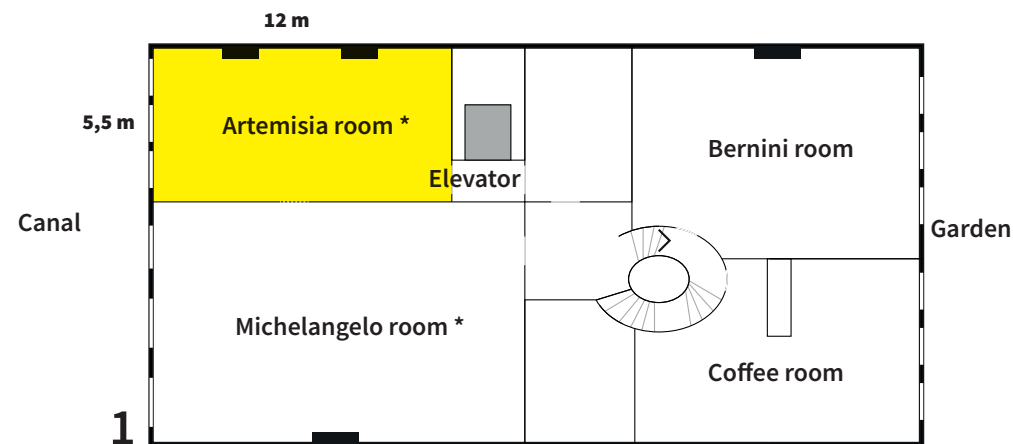

Bernini room

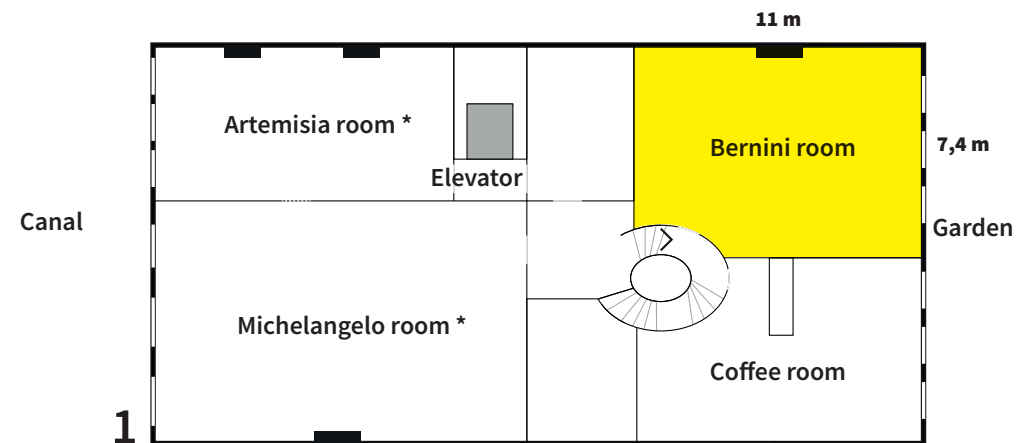
